He is dedicated to ensuring the Tribe's longevity through sound business decisions that will fortify the sustainability of its enterprises and core programs for future generations. As the youngest Tribal Member elected as an officer of the Tribe, Anthony hopes to honor his ancestors and give thanks to all who have played a part in bringing the Tribe to this point.

Treasurer Arroyo began serving the people of his Tribe by working in the fiscal department back in 2016. Starting as a temporary fiscal clerk assisting a short-handed department during an annual audit, he worked his way up through hands-on training with a strong desire to learn and a dedicated work ethic.
