We're Here When Emergencies Can't wait!

The Habematolel Pomo of Upper Lake Health & Human Services (HHS) Department provides emergency assistance to tribal members and eligible families experiencing situations that pose an immediate threat to health, safety, or well-being. If you or someone you know is facing a crisis, HHS may be able to help connect you with emergency resources and supportive services.

What is considered an Emergency ?

Emergency situations may include:

- Child safety concerns
- Domestic Violence
- Sexual Assault
- Human Trafficking
- Elder abuse or neglect
- Immediate safety concerns involving children or vulnerable adults
- Loss or housing due to an emergency (such as a fire or natural disaster)
- Extended power outages affecting medically vulnerable individuals
- Other urgent situations where a person's health or safety is at immediate risk

If you are unsure whether your situation is an emergency, please call. Our staff will help determine the most appropriate resources and services available.

How HHS May Be Able To Help

Depending on the situation, HHS may provide or coordinate:

- Crisis support and safety planning
- Referrals to emergency services and community resources
- Emergency lodging when appropriate
- Food, water, clothing and basic hygiene supplies
- Transportation to safe locations or essential services
- Assistance with child welfare and ICWA-related emergencies
- Referrals for behavioral health, victim services, and other supportive programs

If Someone is in Immediate Danger Call 911 Immediately

- A medical emergency
- A fire
- A crime in progress
- Immediate danger to a person
- Serious injury
- An immediate threat to a child or vulnerable adult
